Paul wants to draw.


There it is!






He draws three shapes.

Are they eyes?




Paul fills in the big dot. He stays in the lines. Is it a nose?

The box gets four legs with feet. Will Paul draw a cat?






The big, black dot gets a smile. What has Paul drawn? He wants us to tell him what we think it is.
