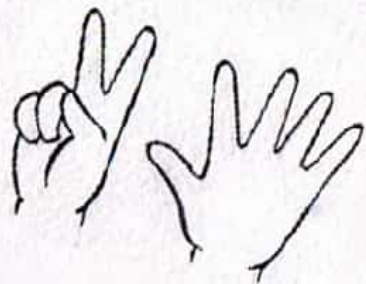


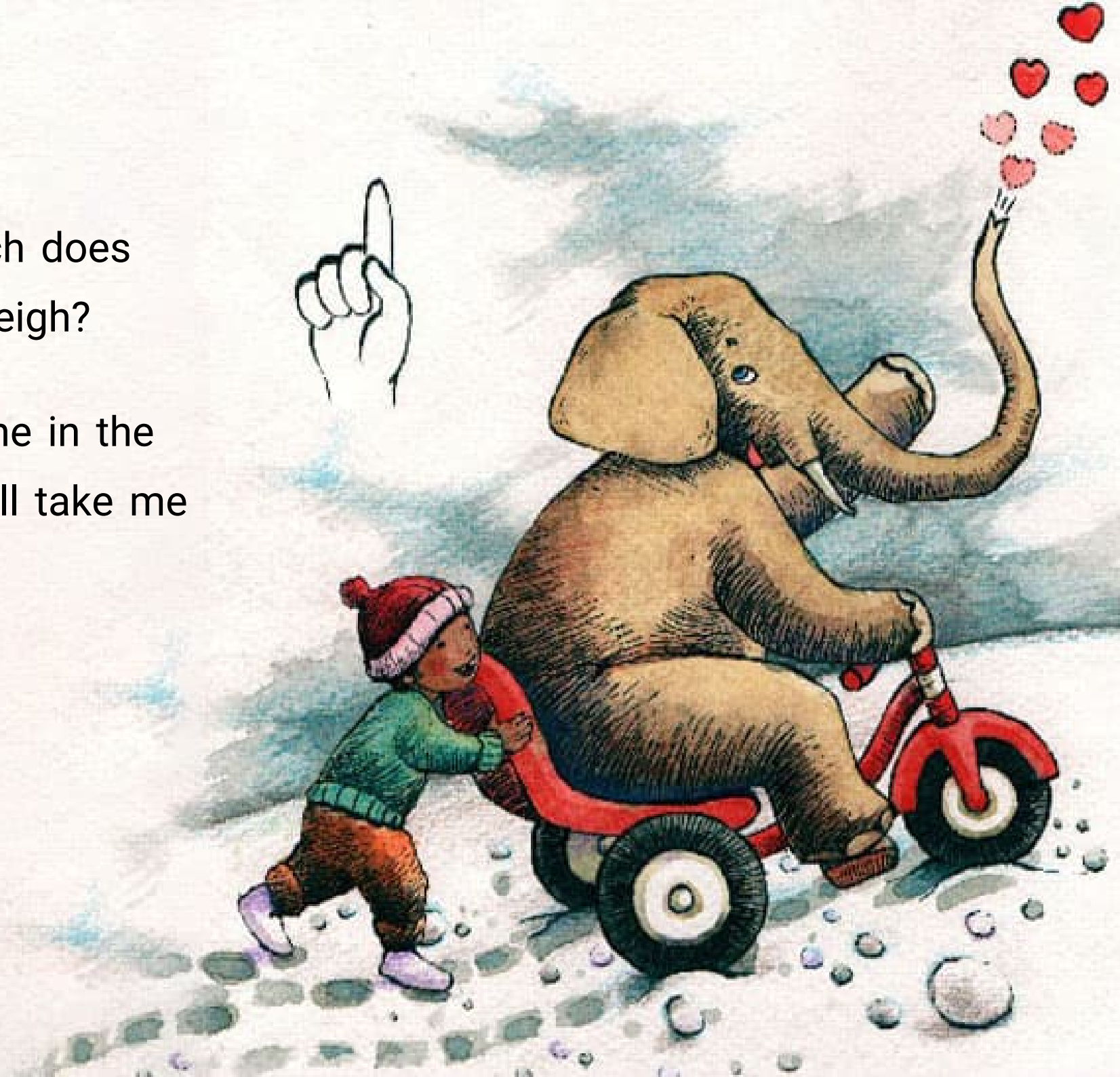

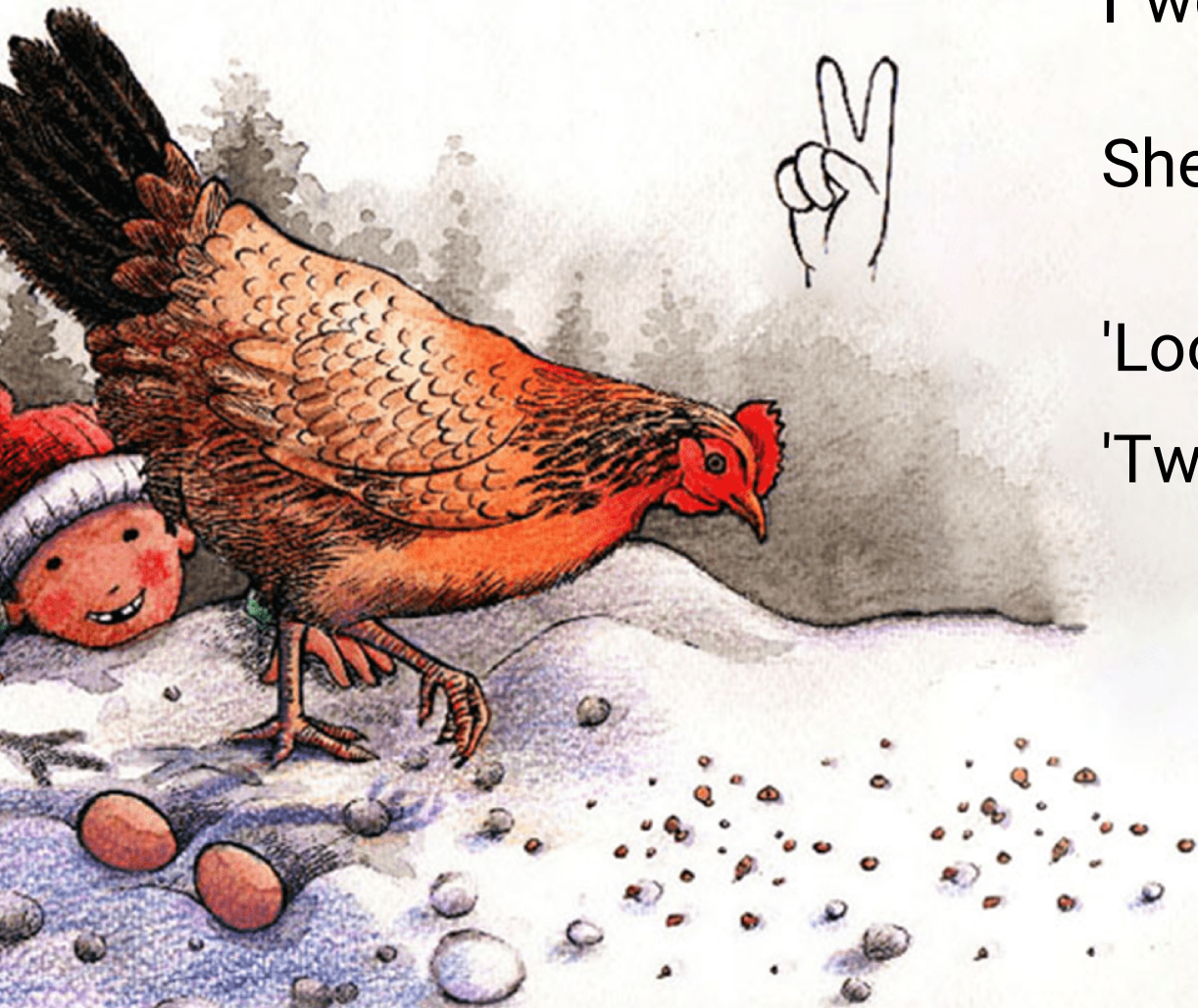

Hold out your hand.

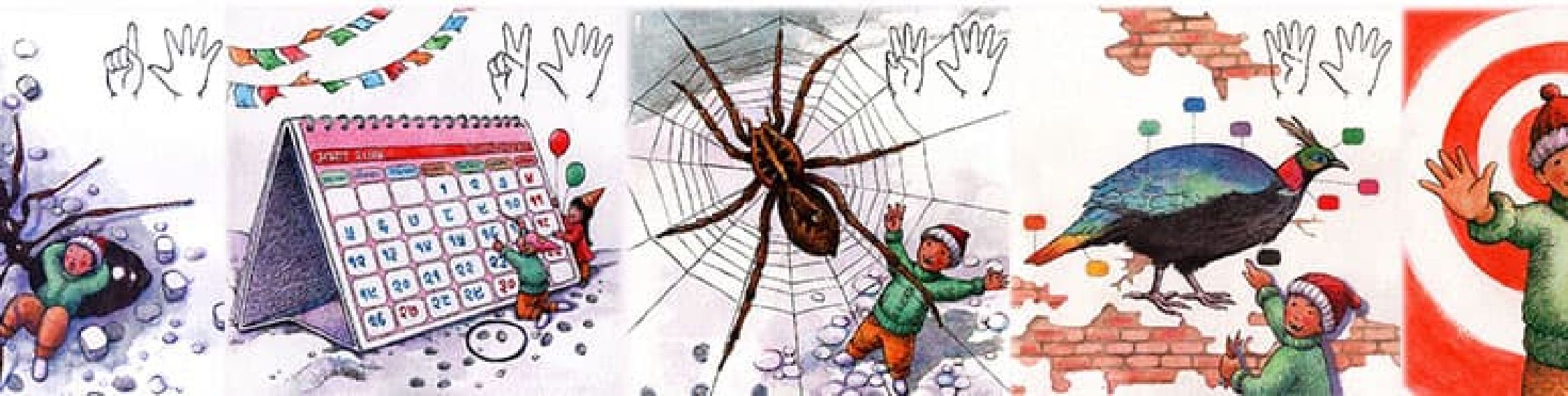
Now the other one,
