Bon's family laugh. That is a surprise!





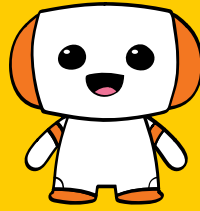
Finally, after a week of preparing, Bon is having fun with all of his family!
