




Jill wants to spend some time at her grandmother's house. It is full of books that they can share. It is like a book nook!

Her grandmother says that she has three books on the go, but she wants Jill to pick a new book for today.




Jill picks a small, brown book with a thin spine. Her grandmother smiles. She tells Jill that she always picks the best books.
