His dad builds the little stove they need. It is just made from rocks and dried coconut leaves. Then the iron pot sits on top.






'This will be easy,' Abdul boasts. Then he tips the flour into the coconut milk which splashes all over his face.

His mother tries to tell him to be gentle with the spoon.






Pretty soon, the batter is very thick and won't drip off the spoon.

He is very proud of himself.












When he gets back, a terrible smell meets his nostrils.

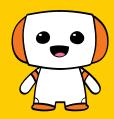
'Oh no!' he did not check the cake and now it is burnt.
