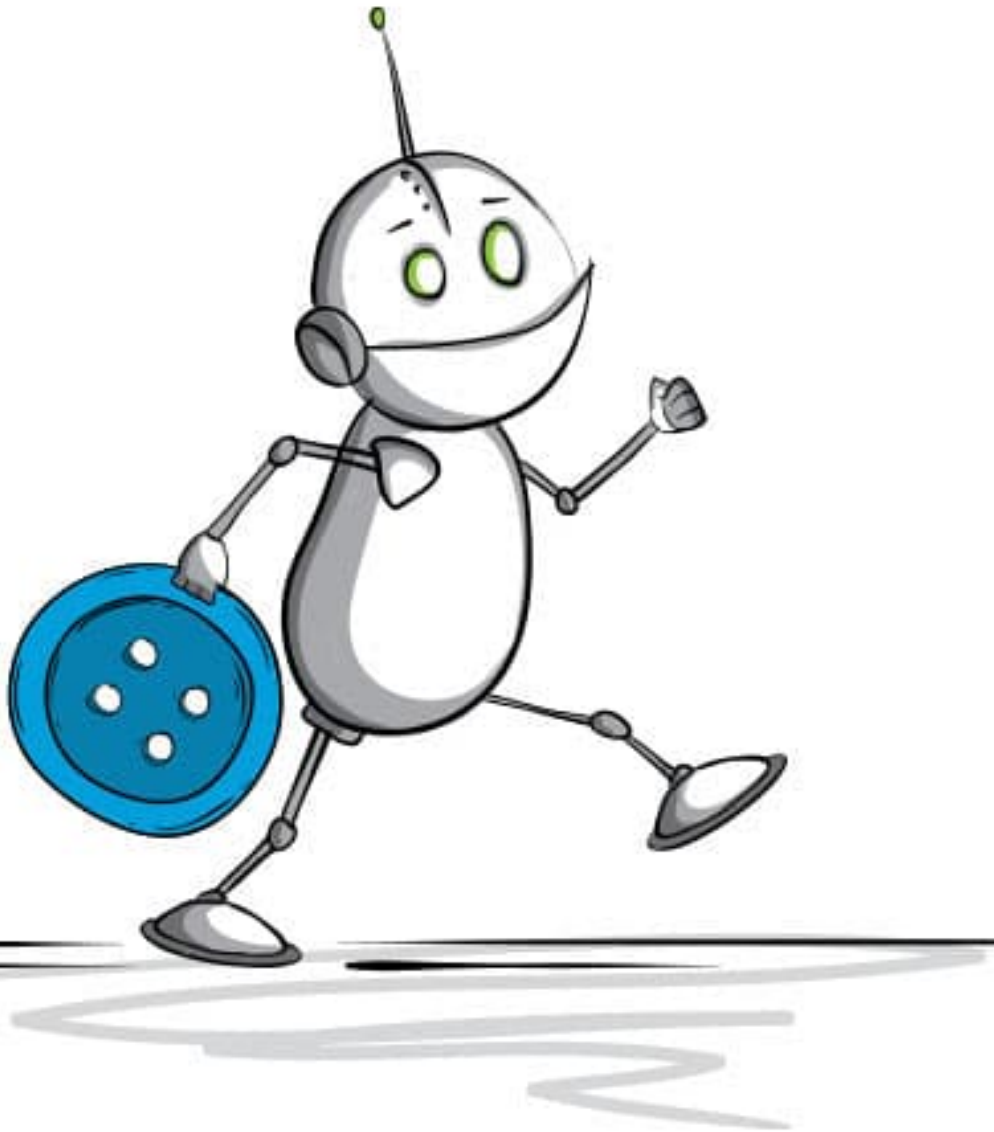




He is tiny.



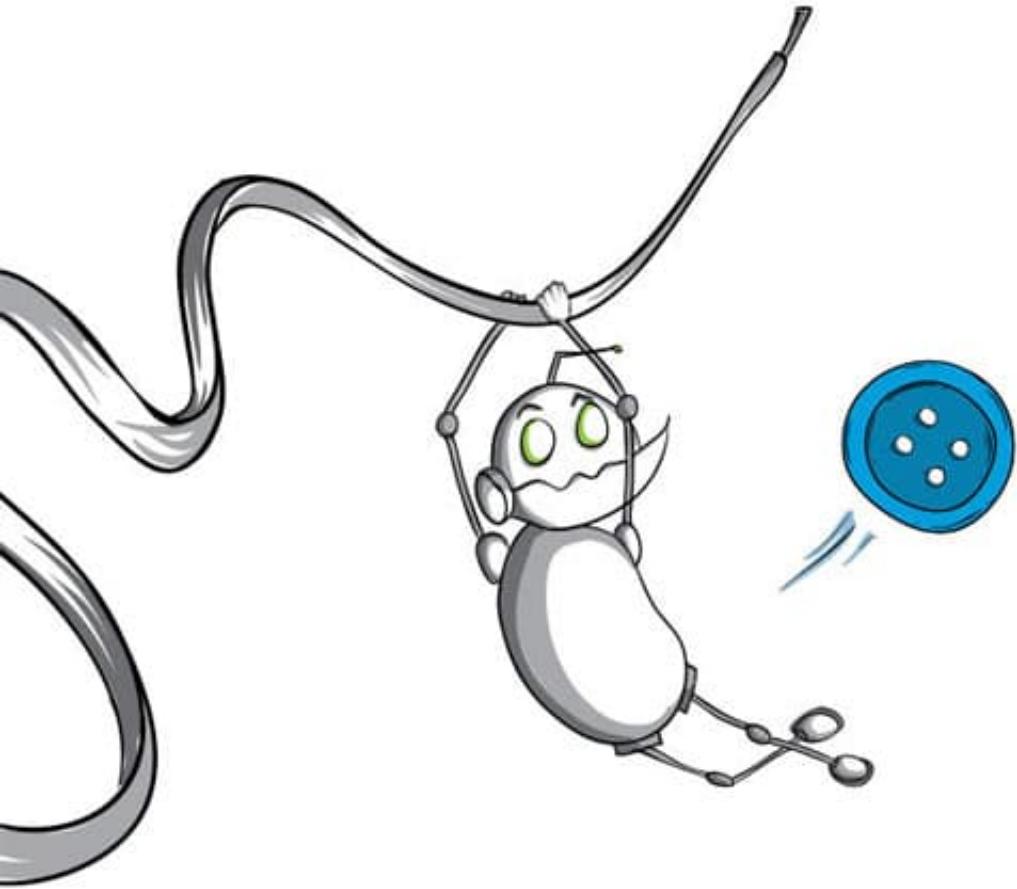

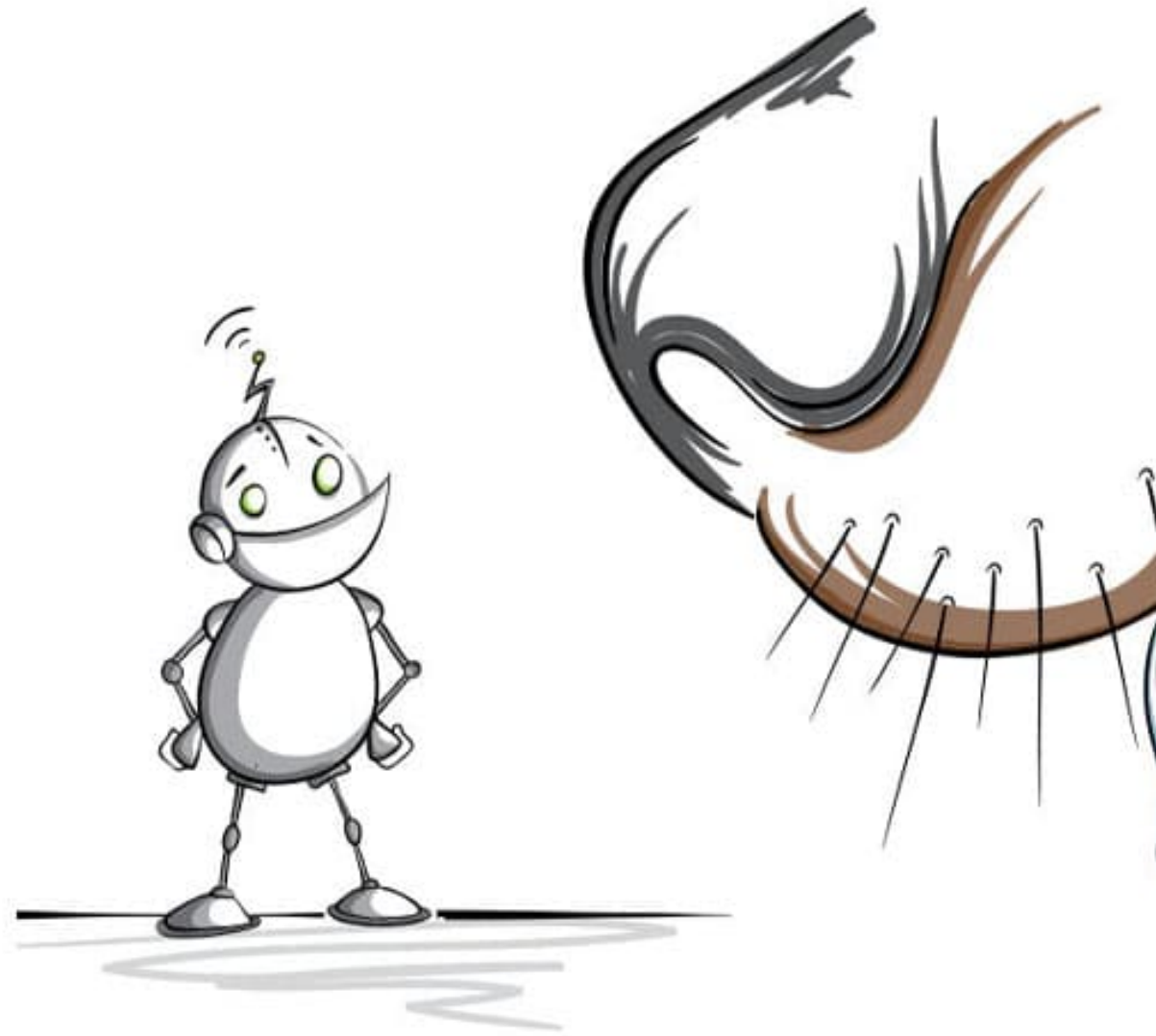

It is a big dog.



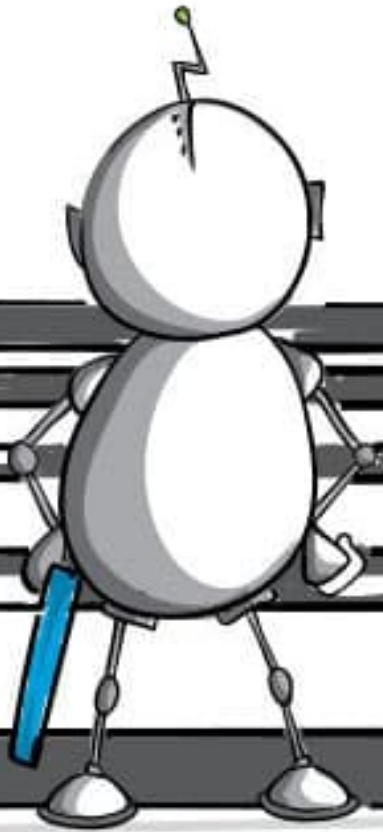

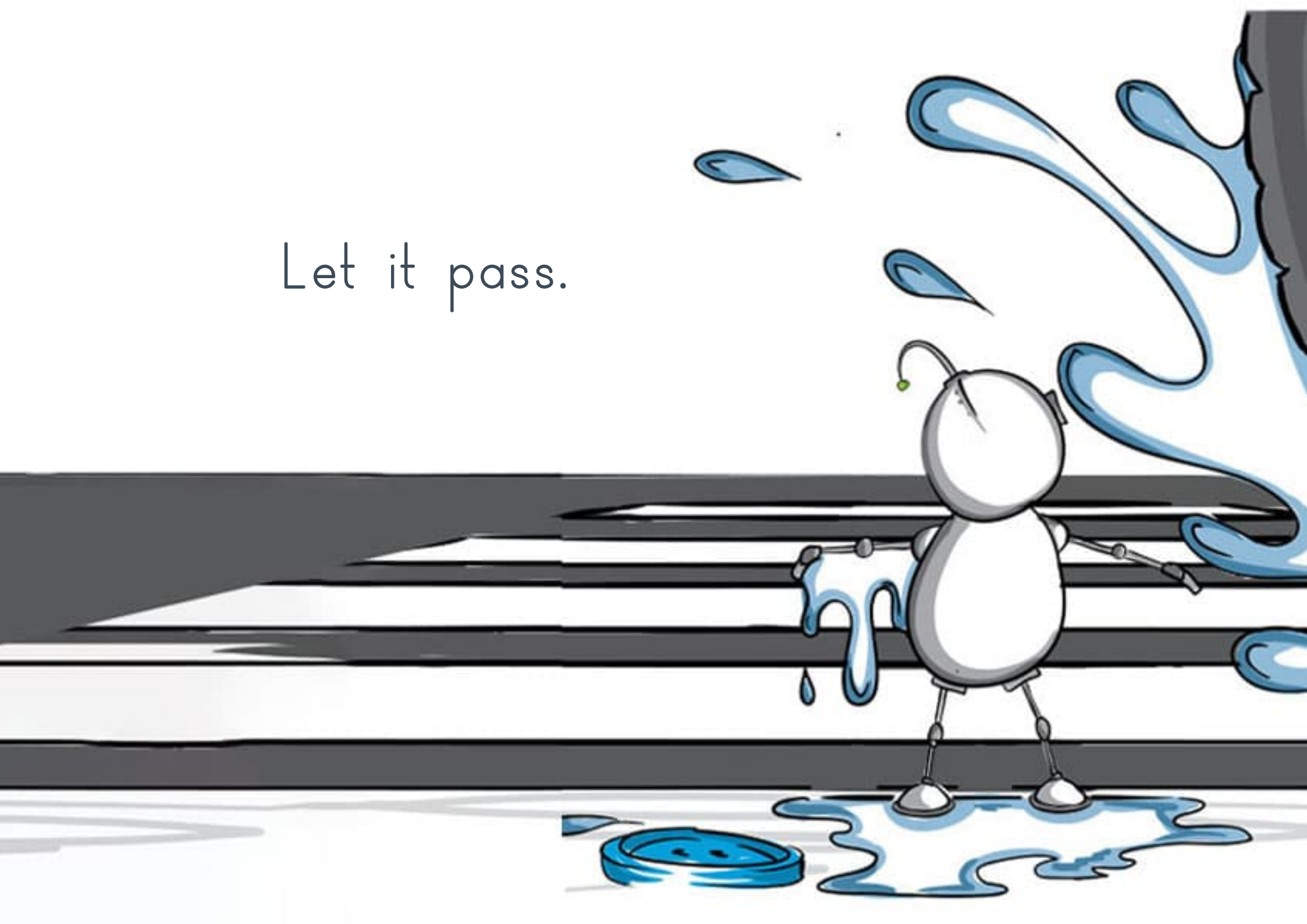

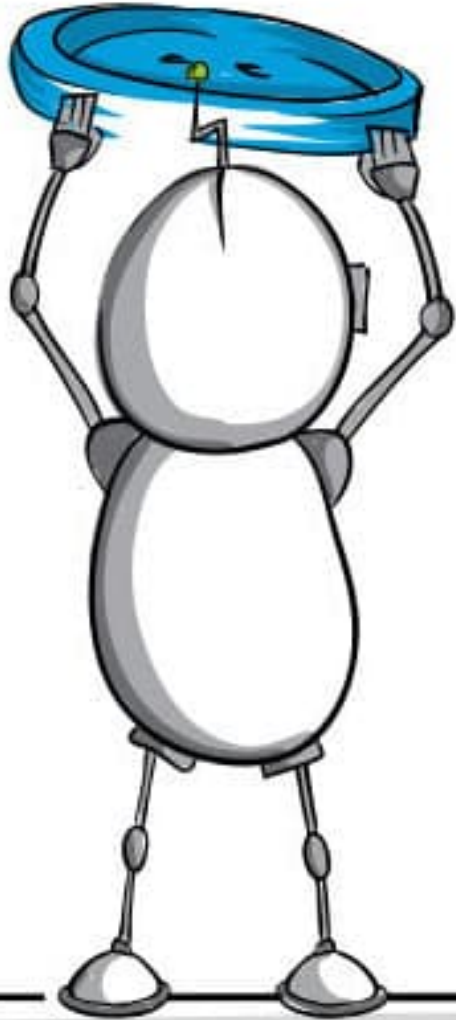
