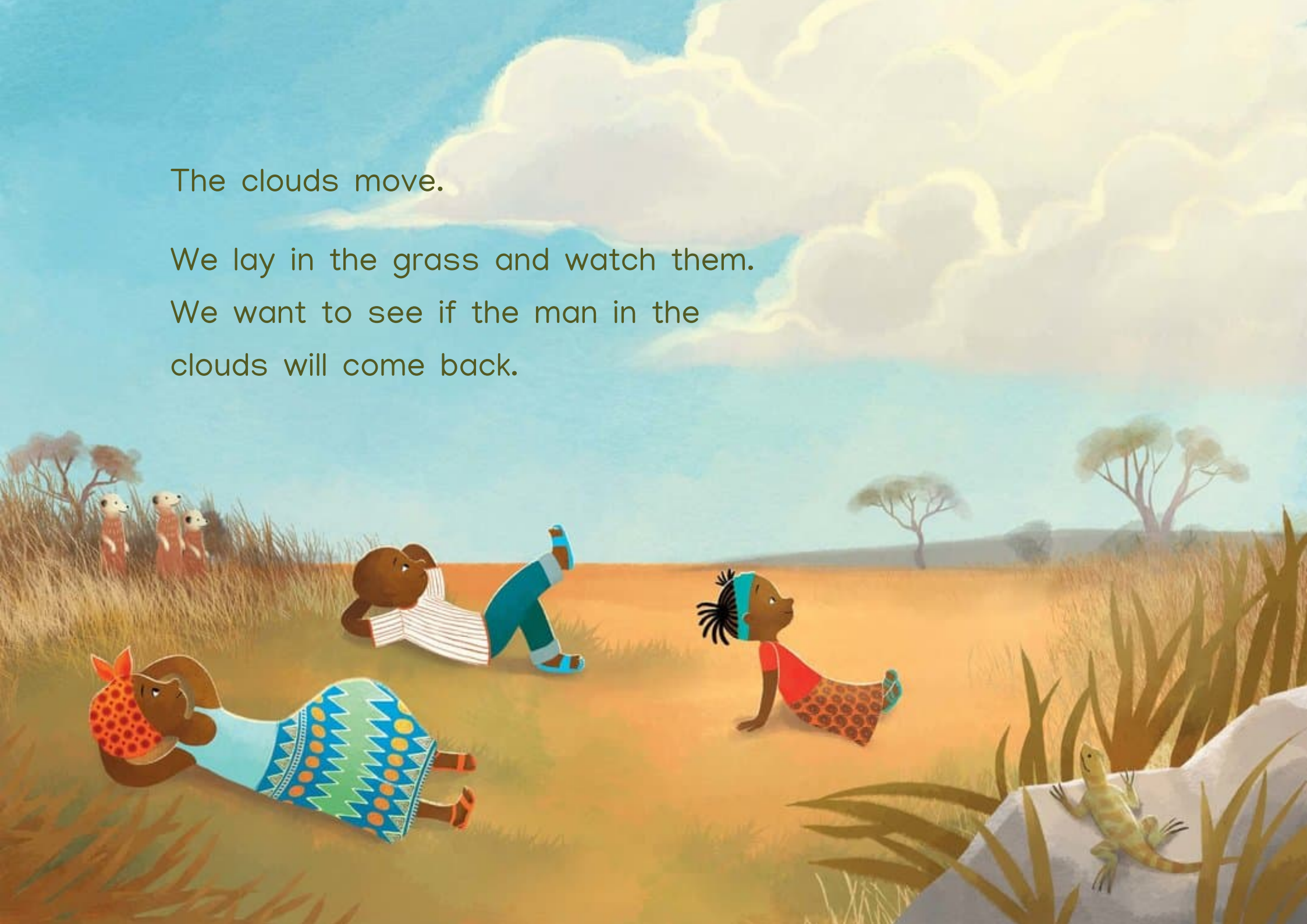
We can see a human shape in the clouds!

And he has brought a friend with him. The lady and the man jump in the clouds and do a jig. We do a jig too.





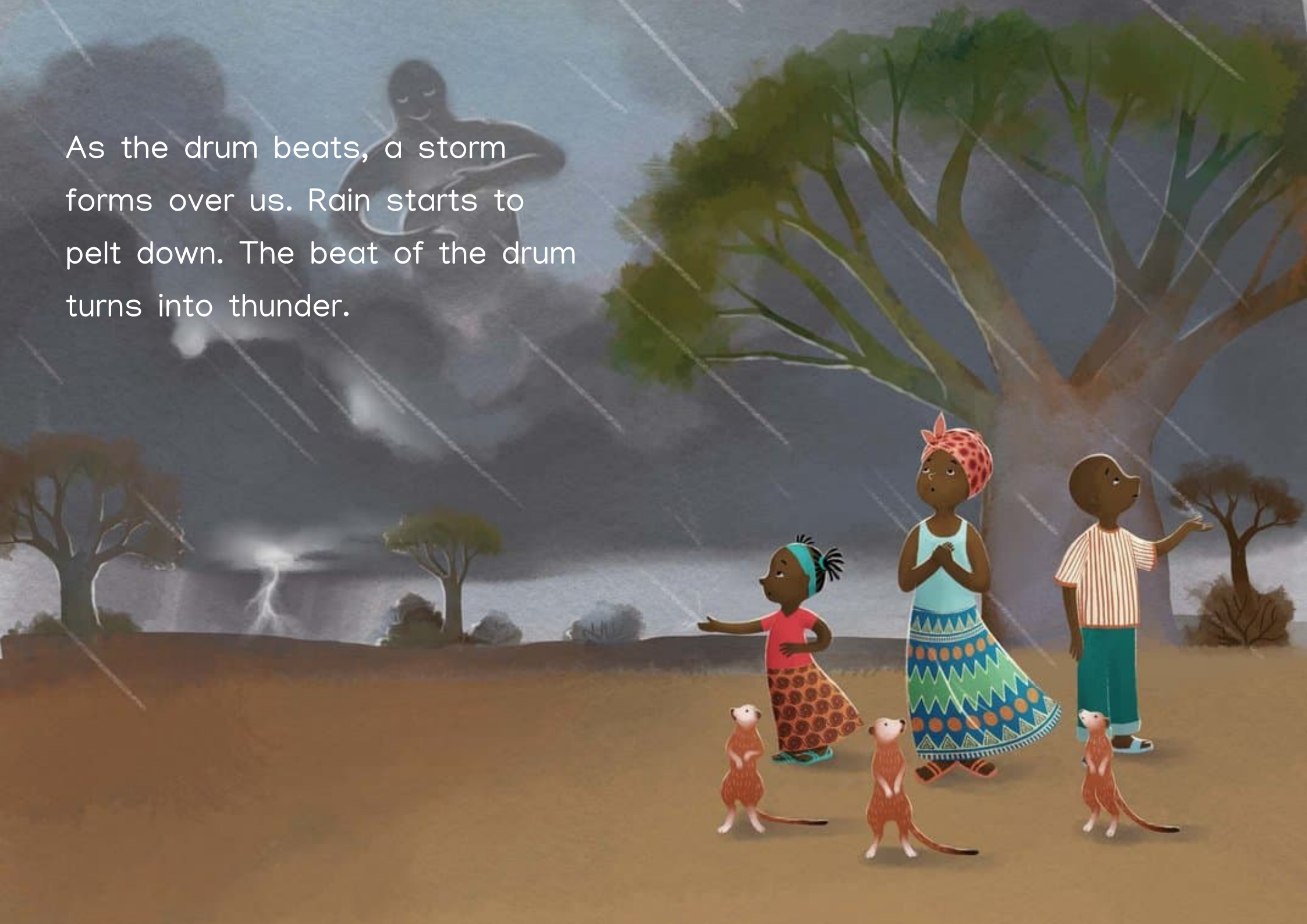
Now the men in the clouds are singing. They look like they have strong lungs. They raise up their arms as they belt out a tune.

We run into the house. It is too wet to stay outside and watch the storm. Our parents will want to know where we are.

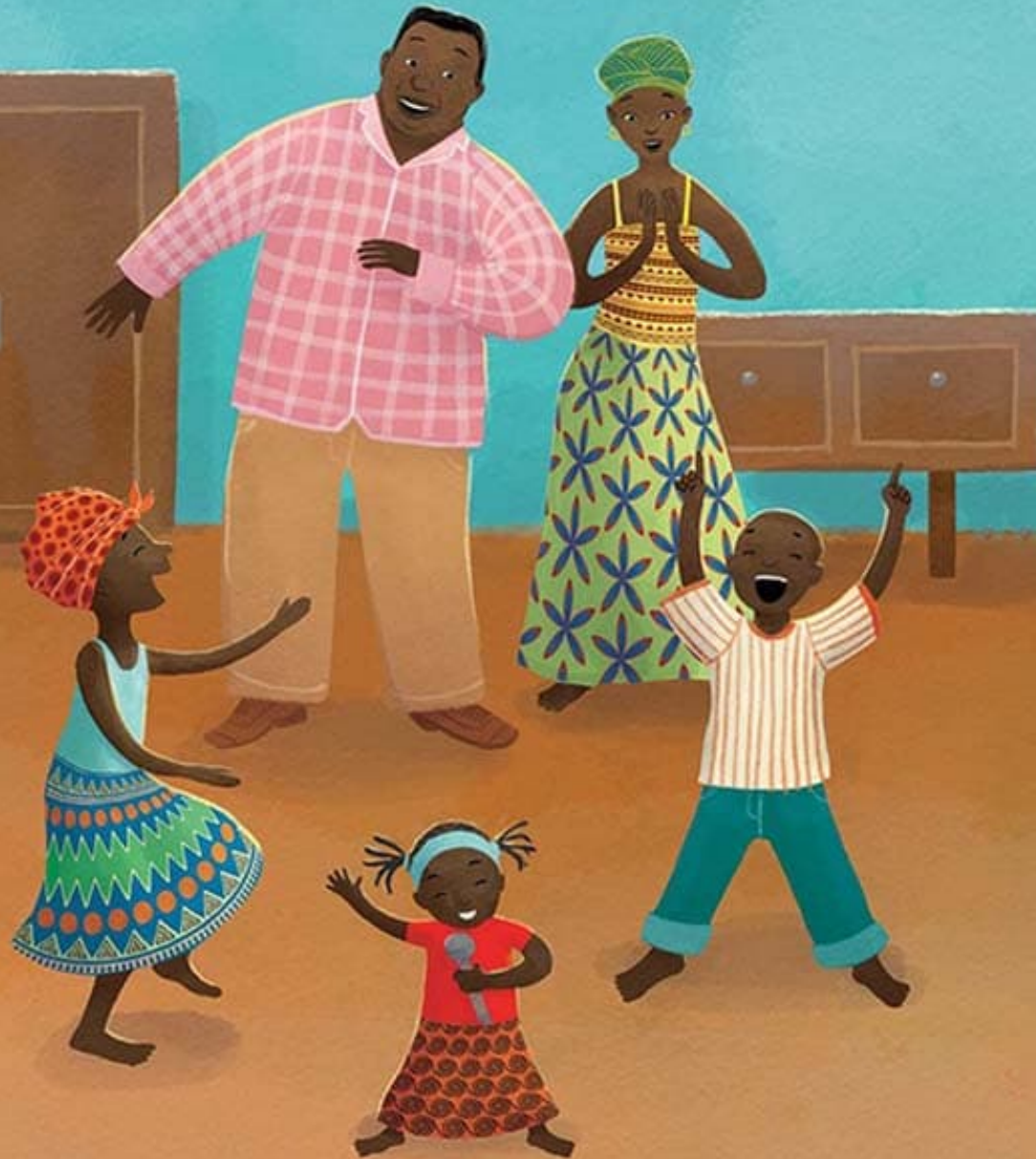






We dance as we dry off. We kick off our wet shoes and leave them by the door. We dry off our hair.
