S9	ci words (sh sound)	special, social, ancient
	si words (sh sound)	vision, sessions, russian, persian, siege, mission, decision
	ti words (sh sound)	patient, potential, production, traditional, christian, question
S10	all other soft c	city, cent, ice, fence, face, rice, lace, cycle, cement
KN	kn	know, knife, kneel, knob, knock, knuckle
EI	ei	ceiling, being, veil, leisure, either, weird
OUGH	ough	tough, rough, enough, bought, plough
SI	s makes /zh/ sound	asian, measure, closure, treasury, casual
UI	ui	fluid, fruit, juice, bruise, suitcase
PH	ph	phone, photo, dolphin, elephant, orphan, pheasant
